THE GOSPEL • JOHN 20:19-31

Reader The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED *Said by all, standing.*

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Intercessor For the leaders of the nations of the world, that they may touch the wounds of the most vulnerable in their midst and feel moved to attend to the needs of the poor, the malnourished, the abused, and the isolated; let us pray to the Lord.

Intercessor That parents may be given the insight to make wise decisions for the life of their children, and be strengthened to share their faith from generation to generation; let us pray to the Lord.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. Today is the 2nd Sunday of Easter

The Easter season lasts from Easter Sunday through the Sunday of Pentecost – a period known as the Great Fifty Days. During this time we celebrate the resurrection of Christ and his appearances among the disciples.

As we celebrate our forgiveness and blessings in the resurrected Christ, the “alleluia’s” return to our liturgy, and we omit the general confession. We also encourage everyone to stand, as able, for prayer and the Great Thanksgiving at the Eucharist. This tradition of standing rather than kneeling during the Easter season reflects our ability in Christ to stand before God and dates back to the First Council at Nicaea, summoned by Emperor Constantine in the year 325.


